Defendant was convicted in the Circuit Court, Hinds County, William F. Coleman, J., of possession of more than one kilogram of marijuana with intent to deliver, and defendant appealed. The Supreme Court, Sullivan, J., held that: (1) evidence supported the conclusion that the defendant's relationship with the marijuana was one of constructive possession and that the defendant was aware of its character and presence and was in dominion over it; (2) evidence was sufficient to support defendant's conviction; and (3) the indictment did charge the defendant with a crime.

Affirmed.
