Defendant was convicted in the Circuit Court, Hinds County, William F. Coleman, J., of capital murder and defendant appealed. The Supreme Court, [491 So.2d 837](#), Hawkins, J., reversed and remanded. On retrial, the Hinds County Circuit Court, on change of venue to Lauderdale County, convicted defendant of murder and sentenced him to life imprisonment, and defendant appealed. The Supreme Court, Prather, J., held that: (1) verdict was not against the overwhelming weight of the evidence and contrary to law; (2) witness who had been convicted of perjury was properly allowed to assert claimed protection of Fifth Amendment; and (3) allegedly improper prosecutorial comments did not amount to improper bolstering.

Affirmed.
