On remand after previous trial and appeal, [379 So.2d 529](#), defendant was convicted in the Circuit Court, Walthall County, Joe N. Pigott, J., of murder. Defendant appealed. The Supreme Court, Hawkins, J., held that: (1) evidence sustained conviction though only direct evidence of defendant's guilt came from two confessed participants; (2) giving of instruction to jury that aiding and abetting involves some participation in criminal act and may be evidenced by some word, overt act or deed was not prejudicial, though there appeared to be no necessity for it; and (3) picture of nothing more than shotgun shell lying in grass where found by officer would have been admissible, and, in view of there being no dispute on particular fact of boy throwing shell into grass, admission of photograph showing boy pointing to the empty shell was not reversible error.

Affirmed.
